Overview

The Texas Center for Superconductivity at the University of Houston works with academic departments in the College of Natural Sciences and Mathematics to offer two Cora Hawley undergraduate or graduate scholarships per year for talented students. Preference may be given to declared physics majors. Each award is \$1000. – \$2500.U.S., and is based on merit.

Criteria

The TcSUH Scholarship Committee will select each recipient based on his or her academic and research accomplishments while an undergraduate or graduate student in a department aligned with the Center. For consideration, an applicant must meet the following criteria: 1) be a current full-time undergraduate or graduate student in the College of Natural Sciences and Mathematics or the Cullen College of Engineering with an interest in superconducting and related materials research, 2) have a current UH GPA of \geq 3.0, and 3) have a minimum of one calendar year as a full-time student remaining in his or her studies.

How to Apply

By April 1 applicants must submit to the TcSUH Scholarship Committee an email with "Cora Hawley Scholarship Application" in the subject field and a single PDF document attachment that contains a full CV (with publication record, if a graduate student, and full copies of published and submitted papers from research performed at UH, and a document giving a brief account of the student's research contribution to each publication or submission), and an unofficial UH transcript. In addition, a letter of recommendation from the student's UH research advisor or TcSUH PI should be submitted separately to the TcSUH Scholarship Committee via email at tcsuhawards@uh.edu.

Notification

Scholarship recipients will be notified when a scholarship is awarded (typically by late May or early June).

Other Information

Eligibility for Other Scholarships

Scholarship recipients may apply for (and accept) other scholarships, fellowships or awards for which they are eligible. If a recipient applies for financial aid, however, these awards may be used in calculating the eligibility level of the recipient's financial aid.

Scholarship Fund Disbursements

Funds will be credited directly to the student's financial account upon verification of enrollment and minimum qualification requirements. Funds may be used to cover expenses for tuition, fees, books, room and board, and/or supplies for the coming academic semester. Any expenses of a recipient in excess of the amount deposited must be borne by the student.

Forfeiture

Failure of the recipient to register for classes (at least twelve semester credit hours for undergraduate and nine semester credit hours for graduate students) by the published UH late registration deadline will constitute an automatic forfeiture of the scholarship for the semester in which it was awarded.
